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SHIP and LHIC

- **SHIP** State Health Improvement Process
 - Localizes health action at the community level to improve population health and reduce disparities
 - Uses 39 health outcome measures to align action in 6 focus areas to increase life expectancy:

Healthy babies	Infectious disease reduction
Healthy social environments	Prevent and control chronic disease
Safe physical environments	Improve health care access


- LHIC Local Health Improvement Coalition
 - CHAC
 - Governing coalition for the Local Health Improvement Plan (LHIP) (5 priorities)

SIM and CIMH

- State Innovation Model (SIM)
 - Released by CMS
 - Purpose: to develop, implement, and test new health care payment and service delivery models at the state level

 Maryland received the "Model Design" award through SIM to develop a Community Integrated Medical Home (CIMH)

Community Integrated Medical Home



CIMH seeks to improve health outcomes by targeting areas of high need and deploying CHWs/CCWs/CMs to help monitor, educate, and facilitate self-management of health conditions

CIMH will help to further integrate the developments/achievements of our LHIP into reducing the burden of health issues in our county

The Role of LHICs

Right now:

- Convening/facilitating/coordinating (CHAC)
- Planning and priority setting (LHIP)
- Performance monitoring (red/yellow/green)

In the near future our LHIC can expect:

- CIMH integration into our LHIP
- Emphasis on increased provider collaboration
- LHIP support of CHWs/CCWs/CMs in our area
